## **PART : A**

- Develop internal audit system for practice teaching.
- Ensure fast process of automation of library.
- Acquaint teaching staff with the grants received hardware upgradation will be thought.

## ***Action taken report on AQAR :-***

### **1. Following efforts were fulfilled satisfactory by the staff :**

- a. Proper monitoring was done for the utilization of grants.
- b. Annual schedule (monthwise) was prepared and time to time meetings were held by principal and incharge of department for proper examination of task.
- c. Two lecturers were appointed on adhoc basis by the management.
- d. LCD projector was fit in general hall. Most of the lectures started delivering lecturers alongwith ppt.
- e. Research proposals were prepared and research work was executed under the banner of CTE.
- f. Internet audit system was generated and proved helpful.
- g. Creating database of library was continued.
- h. Computerization working of majority of departments could be achieved.

### **2. Following efforts needed rethinking :**

- a. Content tests in various methods could not be conducted due to late admission.
  - b. CTE seminars and workshops could not be organized due to time constraint.
  - c. Teaching staff found difficulty in preparing ppt on their own. More rigorous efforts needs to be planned.
  - d. Although database creation of library is being done, process needs to be speeded up.
  - e. Govt. did not issue interview date for conducting interviews of lectures.
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## PART – B

### **1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution.**

- \* Classroom teaching is improved. Maximum use of ICT is being done while delivering the lectures. OHP, LCD are used maximum. Live videos and information derived from internet has improved and enriched the quality of power point presentation of lecturers. Seminars are being organized in general class apart from regular teaching, which fosters communication skill of trainees leading towards a confident teacher to be.
- \* Much attention is paid on practice teaching as it is the backbone of teacher education. Innovations are tried by the faculty members. Head of the institution reviews, the suggestions noted by lecturers in the trainees journal and gives necessary feedback at the end of the year. Principal regularly visits partnering schools. Practice teaching time table is submitted to the principal by every individual teacher educator in advance which denotes well planned practice teaching.
- \* Demonstration lesson of each microteaching, simulation lesson and stray lesson is given by teacher educator. Model lesson plan of each is given to the trainees by teacher educator which helps in enriching lesson planning of trainees.
- \* English medium trainees are provided all needed literature in English.
- \* Physically challenged students are provided necessary help like writer, special software etc.
- \* Inhouse faculty discussion is organized for each and every submission work and thereafter submission work is explained to trainees as a team work. This approach helps in uniform functioning of all groups of college.
- \* Blood donation, literacy work, legal awareness, workshop and various co-curricular activities are pre planned and organized for all round development of trainees.

- \* To acquaint school sector with new reforms CTE (College of teacher education) centre of college organizes three day seminar and workshops. Teacher educators carryout research projects as a part of professional development under the banner of CTE.

- \* Institution has not initiated any new academic program at UG or PG level.

## **3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction:**

### **Curricular Design**

From academic year 2009-10 Gujarat University reformed the B.Ed. syllabus in which college teachers played a key role. Curriculum was based on credit mark system. Following are the main changes in curricular design which were implemented in the year 2009-10.

- \* A new paper of 100 marks was introduced. This paper works Yoga education and Information Technology in Education. “Yoga education” had weightage of 50 marks in which theory portion of 25 marks and practicals of 25 marks. Same marking scheme was framed for “IT in Education”.
- \* Paper – VIII was introduced as elective subject in which trainee had to select any one subject from the list of nine elective subjects.
- \* Credit point for each paper was formed Part – 1 had 32 credit points where as B.Ed. – II had 28 credit points.
- \* School administration unit was covered under compulsory paper instead of elective paper.
- \* Large group seminar and small group seminar representation was introduced to make them aware about seminar in practical work. Weightage of 25 marks was allotted.
- \* To enhance communication ability of trainees communication skill development program was scheduled as a part of practical work. Weightage of 25 marks was allotted.

### **Transaction :**

For the effective transaction of curriculum college teachers put the following efforts. :

- \* Power point presentations were prepared by lectures in all subjects and teaching accompanied with presentation.
- \* For the uniformity of practical work in subject “IT in Education” practical work was explained to the whole class and not in batches.
- \* Apart from seminar presentation as a part of practical work, seminars were conducted in few subjects which made maximum involvement of trainees.
- \* Open house discussion session were organized which provided trainees a platform to express their views and encouraged divergent thinking.

#### **5. Examination reforms implemented :**

- \* To make evaluation more understanding and applicative based, multiple choice questions were included in papers.
- \* Yoga and IT in Education paper objective type questions only.
- \* Question bank was prepared by teacher educators which made paper setting a easy task and efforts were put to eliminate replication questions.

- \* No information is available.

#### **7. Initiative towards faculty development programme:**

Following efforts were put in the direction of computer literacy. :

- \* Information technology literacy program was framed and executed as a part of initiative towards faculty development program. Program was scheduled of five days in which basic operational skills required for using computers was introduced and practiced. This program served as an ice breaking session which encouraged teacher educators in using computers.



- \* Teacher educators were motivated and encouraged to attend various seminars and workshops. Two teacher educator attended National level paper presentation seminar and presented their papers. Details of presented, attended and participated seminars/ workshop is given below.

- \* Literacy program was carried out during internship program in which each and every trainee participated. Each trainee had to literate minimum five illiterates and give all relevant information to the concerned teacher educator.

As a part of “Swarnim Gujarat” celebration, college had to adopt “Mumatpura” village which was allotted by Govt. of Gujarat and perform literacy as well as community services in the village. During this program Principal alongwith whole staff and all trainees visited the village and collected information regarding literacy rate. Apart from conducting literacy program. Trainees performed street drama and Cleanliness and hygiene awareness program was organized. Blood donation camp was organized in the college as a service to mankind. “Prathma Blood Bank” was invited for this program.

- \* **Teachers :-** Each and every teacher educator has a computer on their table. Training has been given to teachers so they can use technology as and when needed. Almost all teachers are using it and upgrading themselves day by day. Internet access is provided on each floor of the college with broadband connection. Teachers are free to do the access however they want.
- \* **Non-teaching staff :** Every non-teaching staff (administrative) has computer on their table and two out of three have internet access through broadband.

- \* **Students :** Trainees are learning computers as a compulsory paper and they are given training by computer instructor. Computer laboratory and library has computers with internet connection and students are allowed to access internet from there.
